Resolution 2025-17: CEO Selection: The Board will consider a resolution to hire and fill the CEO position at Community Roots Housing with a tentative start date of October 6, 2025. This timing provides over three weeks of overlap between the new CEO and Chris. The process for hiring the new CEO was thorough and comprehensive, beginning in December of 2024 with the naming of a search committee, hiring a search firm in January of 2025, and the review of 260 résumés. Ultimately, three finalists participated in interviews with the CRH Leadership Team, Resident Advisory Council and Foundation Board, and final interviews with the full PDA Board. Employment of the CEO is subject to an employment contract that was developed with CRH human resource legal counsel.

Resolution 2025-17

CEO SELECTION

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors to hire Colleen Echohawk to be the Executive Director and serve as Chief Executive Officer of Community Roots Housing.

Community Roots Housing (CRH) is a public corporation organized pursuant to RCW 35.21.660, 35.21.670, and 35.21.730-755, and Seattle Municipal Code Ch. 3.110. As such, it is a political subdivision of the State with an area of operation focused on the City of Seattle.

The purpose of the Program shall be to preserve, develop, own, and operate affordable multifamily housing, as well as cultural, social, and economic facilities and to provide programs and services to promote equity and resilience in communities and to perform other functions as the Board shall determine.

Article III, Section 3(f) of the CRH Rules and Regulations State:

The Board shall select an Executive Director who shall serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Program (CEO). The duties of the Executive Director and the terms and conditions of employment shall be stated in an employment agreement mutually satisfactory to the Executive Committee and the Executive Director. Compensation for services will be set by the Executive Committee. The Executive Director carries out the policies of the Board, directs the staff of the Program and is otherwise the sole employee of the Program directly responsible to the Board for the administration of the Program. The Executive Director shall have the responsibility for the selection, appointment, assignment and release of paid and volunteer personnel. The Executive Director shall be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Board and all committees (including the Executive Committee) and shall, at the discretion of the Board, attend all Board and committee meetings.

The Board conducted a search and hiring process that was thorough and comprehensive, beginning in December of 2024 with the naming of a search committee, hiring a search firm in January of 2025, and the review of 260 résumés.

Three finalists participated in interviews with the CRH Leadership Team, Resident Advisory Council and Foundation Board, and final interviews with the full PDA Board.

Employment of Colleen Echohawk as **CEO** is subject to that certain employment contract dated September 17, 2025.

The Board has determined that the hiring and selection process complied with all laws, regulations, policies, and the CRH Charter and Rules and Regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Community Roots Housing as follows:

- 1. The Board finds and determines that Colleen Echohawk substantially fulfills the qualifications of CFO.
- 2. Hereby selects Colleen Echohawk to be the fifth CEO of Community Roots Housing.
